DAY 3 Singapore—Malacca

3 Tuesday
Hotel: DoubleTree by Hilton Melaka or similar

In the morning explore the city by driving around the Civic District, passing by the Padang, Singapore Cricket Club, historic Parliament House and the National Gallery Singapore. Stop at the Merlion Park and enjoy the impressive views of Marina Bay. Visit Thian Hock Keng Temple, one of Singapore's oldest Buddhist-Taoist temples, before driving past Little India and Chinatown. In the afternoon, head to the top 10 indoor gardens of the world, Gardens by the Bay. After lunch, go to Malacca and transfer to the hotel. Today's lunch and dinner are on your own arrangement. (B)

DAY 4 Malacca—Kuala Lumpur

4 Wednesday
Hotel: Hilton Garden Inn Kuala Lumpur Jalan Tuanku Abdul Rahman North or Ibis Kuala Lumpur City Centre or similar

This morning after breakfast, visit the Dutch Square with the red colored Stadthuys, Christ Church, Clock Tower and the Queen Victoria Fountain. You will also see the Cheng Hoon Teng, which is the oldest functioning Chinese temple in Malaysia which was founded in 1645. The Porta De Santiago, the Gate to the Portuguese fortress "La Formosa", built in 1511, the St. Paul Church. You will have time to stroll around the Jonker street, famous for its Malaccan antiques. Continue your drive to Kuala Lumpur, the

capital of Malaysia. If time permits, we will visit the bustling Night Market in Chinatown and try your skills at bargaining. You will also see the Sri Mahamariamman Temple, one of the most ornate Indian temples where you may even get to see a Hindu wedding if you're lucky. A photo-stop at the Petronas Twin Towers is also included. Today's dinner is on your own arrangement. (B/L)

DAY 7 **Chiang Mai—Chiang Rai**

7 Saturday Hotel: The Imperial Golden Triangle Resort or similar

After breakfast, head to Baan Tawai Village located 25 kilometers from the outskirts of Chiang Mai. There are several family craft workshops. The whole village is engaged in wood carving, where you can know more about the wood carving process and buy the art crafts. After lunch, head to Chiang Rai and visit Wat Rong Khun, which is known to foreigners as the White Temple, is a contemporary, unconventional, privately-owned art exhibit in the style of a Buddhist temple in Chiang Rai Province, Enjoy The Imp Golden Triangle Thai cuisine for dinner. After dinner, experience the tradition of flying sky lantern (2 person share 1 lantern) to pray for the good fortune. (B/L/D)

DAY 8 **Chiang Rai—Chiang Mai**

8 Sunday Hotel: Lotus Pang Suan Kaew Hotel or The Empress Hotel or similar

After breakfast, take a boat ride on the Mekong River. Visit the Golden Triangle area, which is the junction of Myanmar, Laos, and Thailand. It is the preferred tourist area for many tourists to come to Chiang Rai. Later, proceed to Laos Island. Feel the exotic atmosphere. After lunch, watch the Golden Triangle Archway and the Golden Triangle Buddha. The Buddha faces east and seems peaceful and full of happiness and well-being. Here you can feel the different style of Northern Thailand. After, visit the Golden Triangle Opium History Museum, which shows the origin of opium. This place serves a mission of warning future generations to be alert to the impact of drugs on illegal drugs and provide scholars with research and discussion

materials. The museum carries on a huge educational significance. Then, return to Chiang Mai. Today’s dinner is on your own arrangement. (B/L)

DAY 9 **Chiang Mai**

9 Monday Hotel: Lotus Pang Suan Kaew Hotel or The Empress Hotel or similar

After breakfast, proceed to the Maetaeng Elephant Camp, where you can have an up-close experience with the elephant. Ride an elephant with a tropical view and enjoy activities such as painting show from the elephant, bamboo rafting, ox cart rides, get to learn Thailand’s rural way of life, and more. Enjoy the buffet lunch at the elephant camp. Afterward, visit the Kayan tribe. People who live here are known for wearing neck rings for years to lengthen their necks until they get married. Later on, visit Wat Ban Den. It is so called – Blue Temple, which is named due to the color of the main structure. Last stop, head to Elephant Poopoo Paper Park. This park creates a paper by the poo from elephants, in order to maintain and keep a good eco-friendly environment. After, DIY a bookmark at the park. Today’s dinner is arranged on own. (B/L)

DAY 10 **Chiang Mai**

10 Tuesday Hotel: Lotus Pang Suan Kaew Hotel or The Empress Hotel or similar

This morning, head out for a tour of Chiang Mai. Drive up the serpentine road to the magnificently situated Wat Doi Suthep. Perched on a forested mountain, this most sacred Chiang Mai Temple provides a superb view over the city, as well as a wealth of images and frescos. Then visit the summer palace of the royal family of Thailand– Pu Ping Palace. A royal winter palace where the Thai royal comes to enjoy the nice weather that Chiang Mai got to offer during the winter. As it located in the mountain and is in the north region, the weather is incredibly nice compared to Bangkok or in a town. You will be surrounded by beautiful flowers and gardens that will make your day better from the smell. However, it is important to remember no shorts or any reveal clothes at the palace. Enjoy the Empress/Dongtan buffet for lunch.

Afterward, take a ride on Tuk Tuk, the traditional public transportation in Thailand. While on the ride, you can enjoy the beautiful view of the city. Tour the night market in Chiang Mai. Along the road, there are many vendors selling fruits, snacks and art crafts. Return to the hotel afterward. Today’s dinner is arranged on own. (B/L)
